

ANOTHER MILESTONE RETROFIT MOMENT

We have already begun parts of the retrofit. As you know, a new metal ecofriendly roof was installed last Fall and we are now confident that the inside will remain dry for years to come. This spring the old insulation in the ceiling of the school was removed. This was necessary due to the requirement of the Municipality that we have an engineer inspect the complete roof structure to ensure it is secure. There are in fact two roofs – the old flat one that many former students will remember, and the newer peaked roof. Removing the insulation was expensive. We do our best to keep costs down, but it came to more than \$35,000. Once deemed completely secure and safe, new insulation can be installed. It will be high R-value insulation to ensure energy efficiency when heating and cooling the building. Exciting times for sure.

A Word from the President

In 2021, FOMOS began with just five Directors – Alison McAllister, Lynn Quesnel, Aaron Quesnel, Malene Brynildsen and me. Soon Karen MacKenzie joined the team, and now two new Directors, Christine McNaughton and Christianna Jones, will add their skills and talents to the FOMOS leadership. Your FOMOS team is getting stronger!

We anticipated opening part of the building this summer, but in this economy securing large grants for the retrofit is a challenge. The competition for government funding at the provincial and federal level is intense, and priorities change frequently. Not-for-profits like FOMOS are competing with municipalities, and it has been pointed out to us that many other not-for-profits also receive financial support from their municipalities. In our case, FOMOS pays for all the insurance as well as utilities. The cost of decommissioning the building and hauling it to landfill was estimated at \$150,000 back in 2019, so FOMOS is saving the Municipality those costs as well.

So the search for grants continues. According to our lease, signed in 2022, we had to raise \$525,000 for the retrofit by last March, but now we have two more years to raise the funds. FOMOS appreciates the support of Council in allowing the extension. The benefits, when we succeed, will accrue to the social fabric, the artistic community, and to the economy of the Municipality and the entire Island.
