A big THANK-YOU to the many generous donors who contributed to our "Donation Matching" campaign! You keep us going! The Fall campaigns of all charities and not for profits was a challenge due to the postal interruptions. The Architectural Conservancy of Ontario reports they received \$8,550 in November and December, including the matching donations, and they will be issuing tax receipts. In total, the campaign raised nearly \$9,000. That is short of our goal of \$10,000, but some donations arrived in January and will also be matched.

Renovations Update

Last year numerous visits to the school were made by an engineer and contractor to assess the interior roof and ceiling structure. It was determined that there are some issues that need to be dealt with to meet current building codes. Unfortunately, over preceding years, when multiple renovations and changes occurred, engineering studies were not required and so we are now paying the price. And it will be costly.

Even though we plan to do our project in stages, due to financial constraints, we now need studies on the floor/ceiling between the main and lower levels. We are investigating the best, most time friendly and cost effective options.

Grants: The Good News and the Bad News

The good news: We are working on some upcoming grants, both large and small. We are collaborating with the Municipality for grant applications for programming for seniors. These have been very successful and are benefitting both groups. Our offerings included making Christmas gnomes, cake decorating, flow painting and an exercise program for seniors in Providence Bay. A Valentine's Tea is coming up next!



The bad news: Our application to the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC) was unsuccessful despite two years of hard work. Our proposal was to use the main level for both a seniors centre and a hub for artists and artisans. We were under the impression that NOHFC would fund renovations for both purposes, but they determined that artists are businesses, which they don't fund. Of course, we need the artists for rental income when they move in.

In the meantime, we learned about the unexpected requirements for structural remediation in the attic. We will have to hire an engineer to assess the floor of the main level now as well to come up with an updated budget.

This summer promises to once again be chock full of activities, workshops and demonstrations for all ages.
